1. ISB 2019 meeting - Cambridge (Sandra and Pete)

 - Problem paying for the dinner? - Need to look into this
 - Not easy to find (add more explanation)
 - Payment not going through (need to explore this)

- EC dinner on Monday night. Sandra will enquire about restaurants

- Increase membership - follow up from previous meeting:
 - Follow up with people who lapsed - Sandra will ask Ceci
 - Ideas:

- organize additional workshops? Offer discounts?
- Ask other conferences if they would give discounted rates for ISB members
 - BC2 conference in Switzerland - AI: Frederic will ask about a discount for ISB members - done
 - Could add an “affiliated conferences tab” to the website
 - ISB members could apply for travel funding/funded by ISB?
 - Nicole: Follow up with Sylvain re: how much money we have in our budget, then consider offering travel grants to other conferences
 - (After we determine how much money is in our budget): ICBO - AI: Nicole ask Bill and Alex about discount for ISB membership
- AI: Jane will come up with formal proposal for new membership fee structure for companies under a certain size
 - Two rates - one for small companies under 250 people (similar to academic rate), or non profit, one for large companies
- AI from last meeting - Sandra could talk to HR at Cambridge about any tips and suggestions for job-hunting and networking tips. Hasn't received an enthusiastic response from HR. Sandra will keep on trying.
- Nicole to talk to ISCB membership office about their membership incentives (recruiting members), will talk to someone next week

 - Outreach survey - aim to present results at ISB conference. Survey results

 - Specific feedback that we should address - Sandra should consider adding this in her final talk:
 - Conference - Nicole: share this feedback with Cindy and Sue
 - Shorter talks
 - More diverse topics
 - Reduce costs of travel to conference/registration
 - Have conference every 2 years
 - broader involvement of data providers NOT in the medical / molecular field

- We need more experimentalists at the conference to have better user input. - How can we better engage bench researchers?
 - Have a workshop on how to improve lab workflow/data management
 - Laymen's day at conference/open to public - different perspective on biocuration/good data practice
 - Invite local scientists
 - Reach out to Sanger people?
 - Best practices to submit your data to a repository
 - Invite researchers to give talks - they can teach us about their work
- Put affiliation of attendee on name badge - will do
- Try not to have parallel sessions.
- Better communicate the work that ISB/EC does
 - Link to minutes in the newsletter
 - Nicole: Write up a 3-5 bullet point summary of the EC meetings and send out the mailing list (and link to minutes)
- Increase interactions with EC
- Website is badly organized - in progress
- Present our work at bigger conferences - have a biocuration table at bigger conferences? This can be really expensive
- Improve benefits of membership (maybe make this more explicit on the website)
- Increased outreach to more communities
- Membership swag - pins, stickers, t-shirts - could we make stickers for the upcoming conference?
- Networking with national scientific societies
- Increase awareness of the field at the undergraduate level
- IT infrastructure (Andrew, Pete, Rama, Nicole)

 - Pete to look into making the changes live from the staging site (Nicole to ask Andrew too). Goal is to have the new website live before the conference

 - Website committee is supposed to investigate this - we would want to include their name and ORCID. We'd want to allow people to opt in when they renew their membership.
