

 Increasing diversity in presenters and keynote speakers, allowing spots for new groups. There seems to be some redundancy and over representation of some groups.

- Variation. While it is good and still useful, I feel it is fairly similar year to year in what is covered. I do understand that you can only draw from what is going on and what is suggested however.
- Involve people from communities where we do not have a lot of representation
- More poster sessions with fewer posters at the same time so you can catch everyone. More outcome-orientated workshop sessions.
- Choose locations with a strong local biocuration community

Comments about what ISB could provide/improve

- Quarterly newsletter, networking events, professional certification, training
 - organize smaller, local biocuration events, meetups, networking events

- Reach out to data analysis, data science communities, new communities
- Relative lack of external visibility
- Email list is not active
- Website needs improvement
- Find new dedicated people to keep the community going
- Perhaps just more/better communication with members
- Career advancement

- Ensure diversity of topics and participants in future ISB conferences
